

LVNA Agenda Minutes
Tuesday, August 10th, 2004

Attendees: Matt, Doniell, Ernest, Fred, Craig + Wei, Glenn, Janet, Sandi, Stephen Williams, Kim Love-Munoz, Gina Trassare

1. Meeting began at 7:00
 - a. Stephen Williams was introduced as new member and provided minutes of previous meeting
 - b. Matt reviewed progress of association so far
2. Minutes were approved
3. Update on Committees
 - a. Political Affairs: Matt reported that meeting will be held by City on August 11, 2004 to determine if election was necessary due to lack of new candidates- no planning commission items to report.
 - b. Communication: Fred reported that he and Sandi Bushers were to begin creation of the first newsletter and asked committee to bring ideas for the newsletter to the next meeting.
 - c. Code/Beautification: Glenn and Ernest reported that they were attempting to bring in Yvonne De Haan to our next meeting to discuss parking + code enforcement issues- the City is way behind in its enforcement due to the tremendous amount of calls. Glenn also updated the association as to speeding and other activity on his street
 - d. Liquor Loft: Doniell reported the departure of Perry Simms from that DA's office, and that there are no plans to fill his position. Questions were raised as to the city's ability to assume Simms' duties via the city attorney's office. The Council will report to Matt when they have determined that answer.
4. POP Officer Presentation
 - a. POP Officer Kim Love-Munoz and Crime Prevention Specialist Gina Trassare from the rancho police department presented a lecture on the department's resources to tackle The Liquor Loft and crime in our area. Mission of POP: to improve quality of life in neigh; to work w/problems ling-term (fix or eradicate)
 - b. While the station is aware of the problem at The Loft, they have not filled the open position for the POP officer yet. They will do so as soon as they can release him from patrol.
 - c. Both encouraged the association to keep logs of activity along Lincoln Village- calling for service is a key, in their opinion, to holding the area more accountable. Doniell spoke against this, detailing a recent incident in which dispatchers refused to send officers. The City Council is aware of this and is doing what it can to increase response in the area.
 - d. Kim suggested the creation of neighborhood watches on each street that would report to neighborhood association. Gina offered to help start up watches by canvassing homes with association
 - e. Some options are available

- i. Lawsuit against owner of Liquor Loft for damages to neighborhood and other businesses;
 - ii. Put together petition to warn owner of this step
 - iii. Get license plates and addresses of suspicious individuals to compile in log book. These would used when calling or emailing Kim and department.
5. Future Agenda Items and Location of Next Meeting
 - a. Report on efforts to obtain CC+R's to give copy to all members;
 - b. Create t-shirts with LVNA name on them;
 - c. Develop plan of action for Liquor Loft;
 - d. Develop plan for neighborhood watch;
 - e. Create mission statement for LVNA;
 - f. Members agreed to meet on **Tuesday, August 24th at 6:30 pm at Bradshaw Mobile Home Park**. The meeting is expected to last until 8:30 pm. Matt will send out email detailing location and driving directions.
