1. Meeting began at 6:00
2. Minutes were approved
3. Update on Committees:
 - A. Political Affairs: Matt submitted the minutes, agenda, and support documents from the City Council meeting on November 5th. Also, Matt made an announcement about Bradshaw Landing, a new project proposed for Bradshaw in the area now held by the drive-in theatre. The plan currently includes a multiplex theatre, a big box store, a fast food restaurant, sit down restaurants and multiple mixed-use storefronts. The project is slated to begin late spring/early summer of next year and would take at least two years to complete. Finally, he announced that the county would host a County Services Meeting at Branch Center Drive on November 16th as part of a program to create community councils in the unincorporated areas. Matt will attend and encouraged others to do the same

4. POP (Problem Oriented Policing) Presentation
 - A. Officer Jason Manning from the sheriff's department presented a lecture on his department's efforts to deal with crime and other issues in LV
 - B. The following represents highlights from Jason's presentation:
 - POP Officers generally organize proactive operations such as buy/bust and they also deal with long-term situations within neighborhoods
 - There is currently only one POP to serve all of Rancho Cordova and the East Division
 - Jason suggested that the Association bring the following suggestions to the City Council:
 - Approve more POP officers for the city
 - Limit the number of liquor licenses in Rancho Cordova so as to make them more valuable
 - Residents can call in reports to a report writer at 875-9602. If a car is burglarized, residents can bring it to Rockingham for fingerprinting

5. Healthy Start Presentation
 - A. Julie Kaufman, the Coordinator for Healthy Start at AM Winn Elementary School, presented information about her program. The following represents highlights from her presentation:
 - Healthy Start is the social service arm of the school connecting families to services
 - They staff a welfare worker, social worker, Ameri-Corps worker, and family advocate on site
 - Healthy Start would like to collaborate with LVNA to sponsor a Pancake Breakfast in February or March. They already have all the supplies donated but are looking for volunteers to help man the event
