RC Animal Control Up and Running

New Service, Like Others, Already Making an Impact

Commentary By Matt Cummings its own animal control service, which operates out of the Neighborhood Center at 10665 Coloma Road. In doing so, the City has now replaced most County services with a leaner, privately-contracted one. While the SPCA still maintains shelter facilities, Animal Control will be in charge of the daily operations. If change like this sends any signal, consider the most basic one: residents deserve better. This city appears willing to look at every service, even the ones that return lost pets to their families. And I'll bet there's more changes to come.

Time wasn't too long ago, when you noticed a loose dog in your neighborhood, and the best advice one could give was, "Lock the door and hope it doesn't have a key!" Getting the County to provide help on this subject was equally daunting. Regardless if that rooster crowed, or that dog barked, there was a better chance of a nuclear holocaust occurring than the County tracking down a wayward pet. The bigger question on people's minds that was worth debating: how would Rancho Cordova respond to the County's service?

That answer was given on April 1st, when the City established

Allied Waste's "Bulky Pickup" Program Benefits Lincoln Village

It's easier than ever to schedule a "bulky items" pickup from Allied Waste. Each household can call our garbage company up to three times per calendar year to schedule a pickup at no additional charge. Follow these easy steps to ensure a successful pickup of your items:

- Call Allied Waste at (916) 638-9000 between 7am-5pm Monday-Friday to schedule your pickup. Your appointment will be scheduled within 2 business days of your call.
- Place your unwanted bulky items at the curb for pickup no sooner than **2 days** before your pickup. Make sure to keep your piles limited to 10 cubic yards or (10 ft x 7 ft x 4 ft).

Please note that appliances that are recyclable will be picked up by a separate truck.

The following items are acceptable to place out on the curb for pickup: barbecues, chairs, sofas and mattresses, large branches, appliances, computer/monitors, televisions and other electronics, and tires.

Items that are not acceptable include: automobiles or automobile parts, boats or boat parts, backyard spas, batteries of any kind, construction material like concrete, dirt, rocks, brick, sheetrock and roofing material, large tree stumps, medical waste, and items like paint, pesticides and cleaning products.

Please remember to call Allied Waste **before** placing your items out on the curb for pickup. Call Allied Waste, not the County, if you have any questions. Let's keep our neighborhood looking clean by following the above guidelines.
